Text: Mark 10.35-45, NIV

- 35 Then James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to him. "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask."
- ³⁶ "What do you want me to do for you?" he asked.
- ³⁷ They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory."

- 38 "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said. "Can you drink the cup I drink or be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with?"
- 39 "We can," they answered.

• Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink and be baptized with the baptism I am baptized with, ⁴⁰ but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared."

• ⁴¹ When the ten heard about this, they became indignant with James and John. ⁴² Jesus called them together and said, "You know that those who are regarded as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them.

• 43 Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, 44 and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. 45 For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

I.What we want most

- "Teacher," they said, "we want you to do for us whatever we ask."
- This is true for <u>all humanity</u>
- Sin = <u>selfishness</u>
- We think Jesus came to make us ...

2. Our *ignorance*

- 38 "You don't know what you are asking,"
- Often we act/speak out of gross ignorance
- Jesus <u>knows us</u> better that we know ourselves
- Jesus has grace for our ignorance!

3. What Jesus <u>requires</u>

- Jesus said to them, "You will drink the cup I drink
- What was 'the cup'?
- The <u>willingness to die</u>

The 'Cup'

- Abba! Father! All things are possible for you; remove <u>this cup</u> from me; yet not what I will, but what you will. (Mark 14:36)
- The cup was the <u>death</u> he was about to endure. So he was saying to James and John: if you want to rule with me in my glory the way you are asking, then you must <u>die with</u> me —you must drink the same cup.

4. What Jesus offers

- ⁴⁵ For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."
- Jesus offers His <u>service</u>
- Jesus paid our <u>ransom</u>
- He also paid it for many others!

Ready to serve?

- Jesus knows our <u>needs</u>
- Jesus calls us to a life of <u>sacrifice</u>
- Jesus <u>died for us!</u>
- Jesus is still <u>serving us!</u>
- As we serve Jesus in <u>sacrificial love</u>, we accomplish His ongoing desire to reach others – more of the 'many'
- Our problems are <u>opportunities!</u>
