In the Bible people who have hope are very different from optimists! In this video, we'll explore how biblical hope looks to God's character alone as a basis for trusting that the future will be better than the present.

HOPE means waiting . .

o² The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. Isaiah 9:2 (NIV) •Do we need light? Political, economic and social climate: then and now

HOPE in Psalm 42 (and 43)

- For the director of music. A maskil^[c] of the Sons of Korah.
- ¹ As the deer pants for streams of water,

so my soul pants for you, my God. ² My soul thirsts for God, for the living God.

When can I go and meet with God?

^{o³} My tears have been my food day and night, while people say to me all day long, "Where is your God?"

o⁴ These things I remember as I pour out my soul: how I used to go to the house of God under the protection of the Mighty One with shouts of joy and praise among the festive throng.

o⁵ Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God.

•⁶ My soul is downcast within me; therefore I will remember you from the land of the Jordan, the heights of Hermon—from Mount Mizar.

^{o⁷} Deep calls to deep in the roar of your waterfalls; all your waves and breakers have swept over me.

o⁸ By day the LORD directs his love, at night his song is with me—a prayer to the God of my life.
o⁹ I say to God my Rock, "Why have you forgotten me? Why must I go about mourning, oppressed by the enemy?"

o¹⁰ My bones suffer mortal agony as my foes taunt me, saying to me all day long, "Where is your God?" o¹¹ Why, my soul, are you downcast? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God.

1.He <u>thirsts</u> for <u>God.</u>

- 2: "As a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for you, O God. My soul <u>thirsts for God</u>, for the living God.
- He is not thirsting mainly for <u>escape</u> from his enemies or for their destruction – He <u>wants God!</u>

2.He remembers past <u>experiences</u>

•4: "These things I **remember**, as I pour out my soul: how I would go with the throng and lead them in procession to the house of God with glad shouts and songs of praise, a multitude keeping festival."

• He is confirming his faith in the midst of turmoil and discouragement by remembering how real God was in <u>corporate worship</u>.

3.He preaches to his own soul.

•Verse 5: "Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? <u>Hope in</u> <u>God</u>; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God."

•We must learn to preach the <u>truth</u> to ourselves

4.He affirms <u>God's sovereign</u> <u>love</u>

- 8: "By day the Lord commands his steadfast love, and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life."
- And even though he says it looks as if God has forgotten him, he never stops believing in the <u>absolute sovereignty</u> of God over all his adversity.

5.He asks God Why

•9: "I say to God, my rock: <u>'Why</u> have you forgotten me? Why do I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?'"

•What he means is that, it <u>looks like</u> God has forgotten him. It <u>feels</u> as if God has forgotten him.

6.He <u>SINGS!</u>

8: "By day the Lord commands his steadfast love, and at night <u>his</u>
 <u>song</u> is with me, a prayer to the God of my life."

•This is a <u>prayer</u> song and <u>pleading</u> song — a song "to the God of my life." That is, a song pleading for his <u>life.</u>

HOPE in Romans 8

 ¹⁸ I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. ¹⁹ For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. o²⁰ For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God.

o²² We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. ²³ Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies.

o²⁴ For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently.

Paul's HOPE was in <u>Jesus!</u>

o²⁴ For in this <u>hope</u> we were <u>saved</u>.
oTherefore:

•²⁸ And we know that in <u>all things</u> God works for the <u>good</u> of those who <u>love</u> him, who have been called according to his purpose.

Our HOPE is <u>JESUS!</u>
