DURHAM — In the first meeting since its newest member, John Munroe, was elected, the school committee named Gene L. Brown to serve as chairman and Dr. Alexis A. Caron as vice chairman.

Sgt. Blaine Footman of the Androscoggin Sheriff's Department was re-appointed truant officer and it was voted to establish the first Thursday of each month as the regular meeting night.

Any changes in meetings will be announced.

A communication was

received from Ronald Roberge regarding when negotiations for the next teachers' contract will begin. Under personnel, a new bus driver was named to replace Mrs. Pam Whitworth, who will be leaving in the near future.

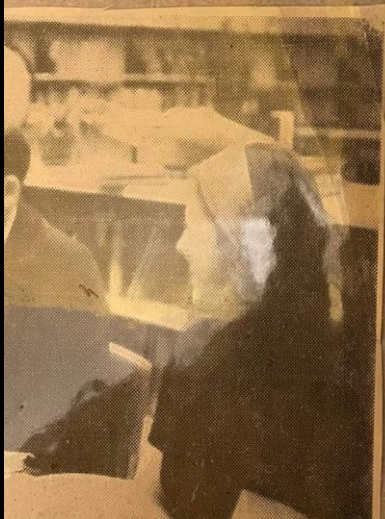
It was decided to wait until after school closes to insulate the end classrooms in the schools after it was reported there was no money in the current budget to pay the cost. Secondary transportation was discussed and a newly established committee to look into the problem will meet at 7 p.m. Thursday for further discussion.

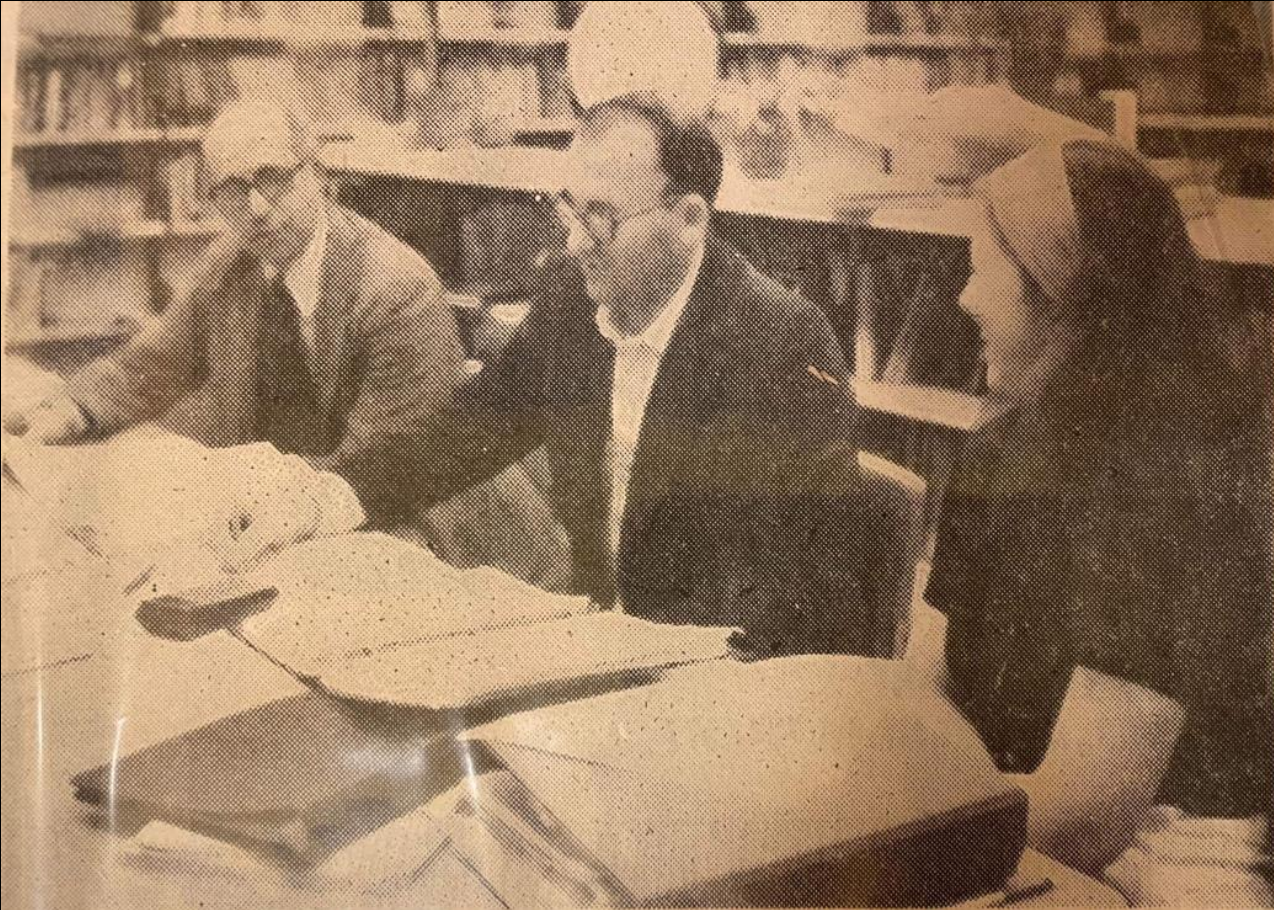
In other action, the superintendent was authorized to locate a volunteer or part-time typist to type the self-evaluation report, which is lengthy, he said.

It was voted to try to hold the pre-school immunization clinics for Durham's preschoolers at the same time physicals are scheduled for kindergarten registration at the school.

In recent years, the pre-school immunization clinic has been held in Lisbon Falls in conjunction with the towns of Lisbon and Sabattus and attendance by Durham youngsters has been low.

Following the close of the open portion of the meeting, the board went into executive session to continue teacher negotiations. According to an informed source, the stalled teachers negotiations are expected to go to arbitration some time in mid-April.

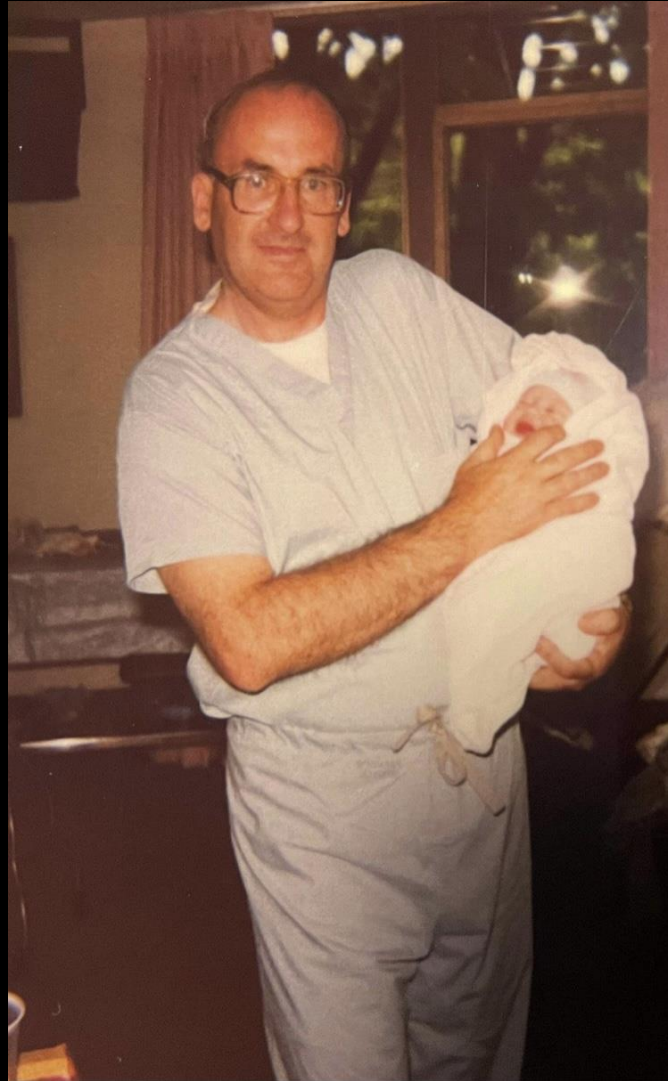














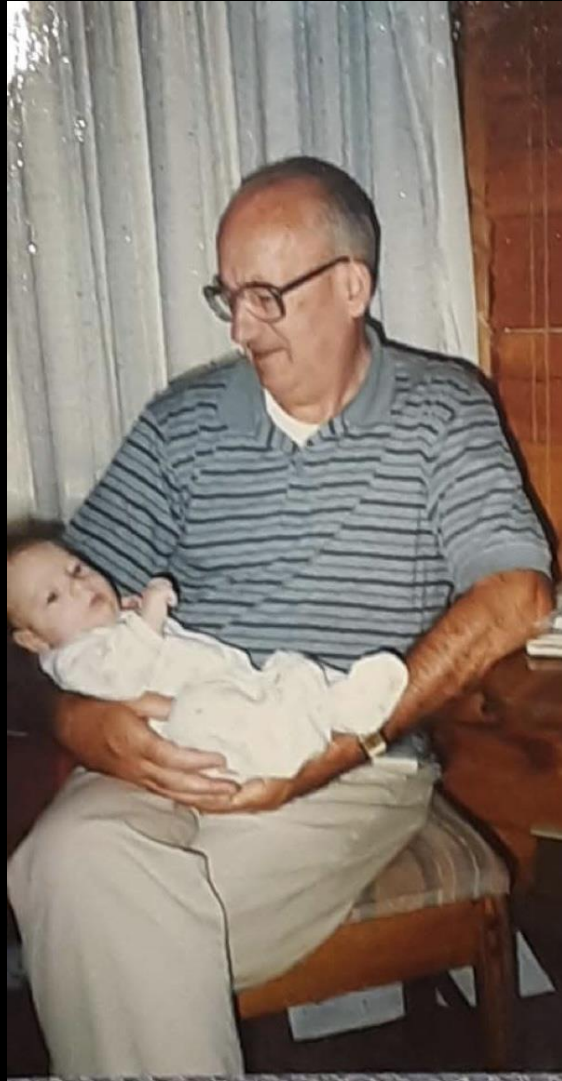
