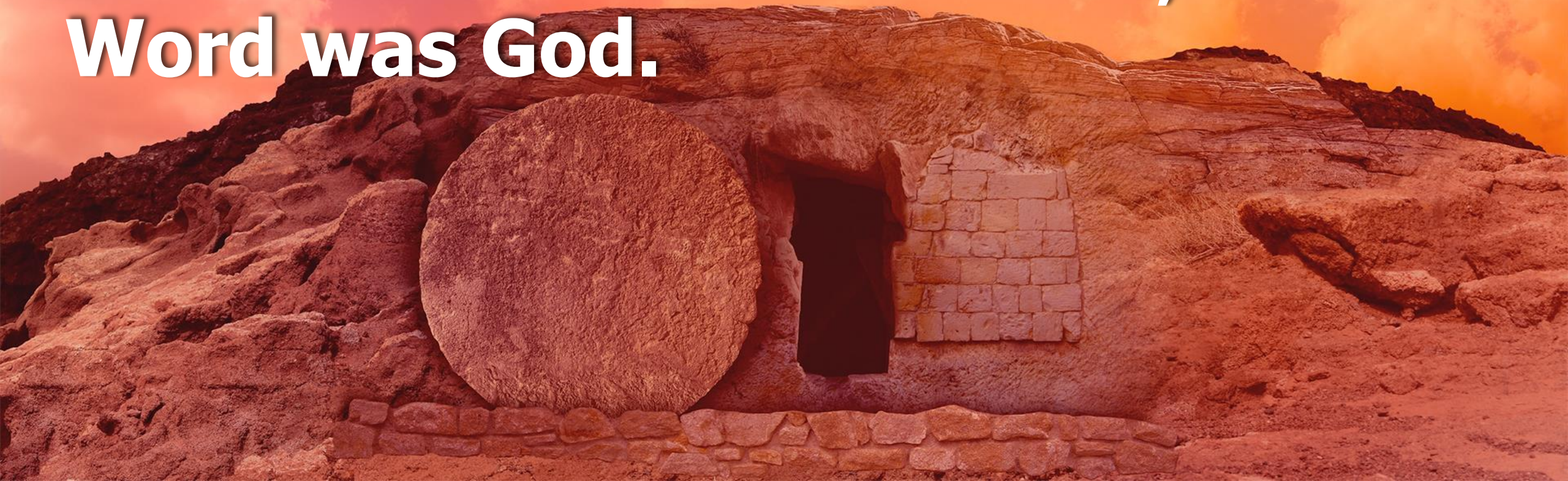
Genesis 1:1 (NASB)

John 1:1-3 & 14 (NASB)

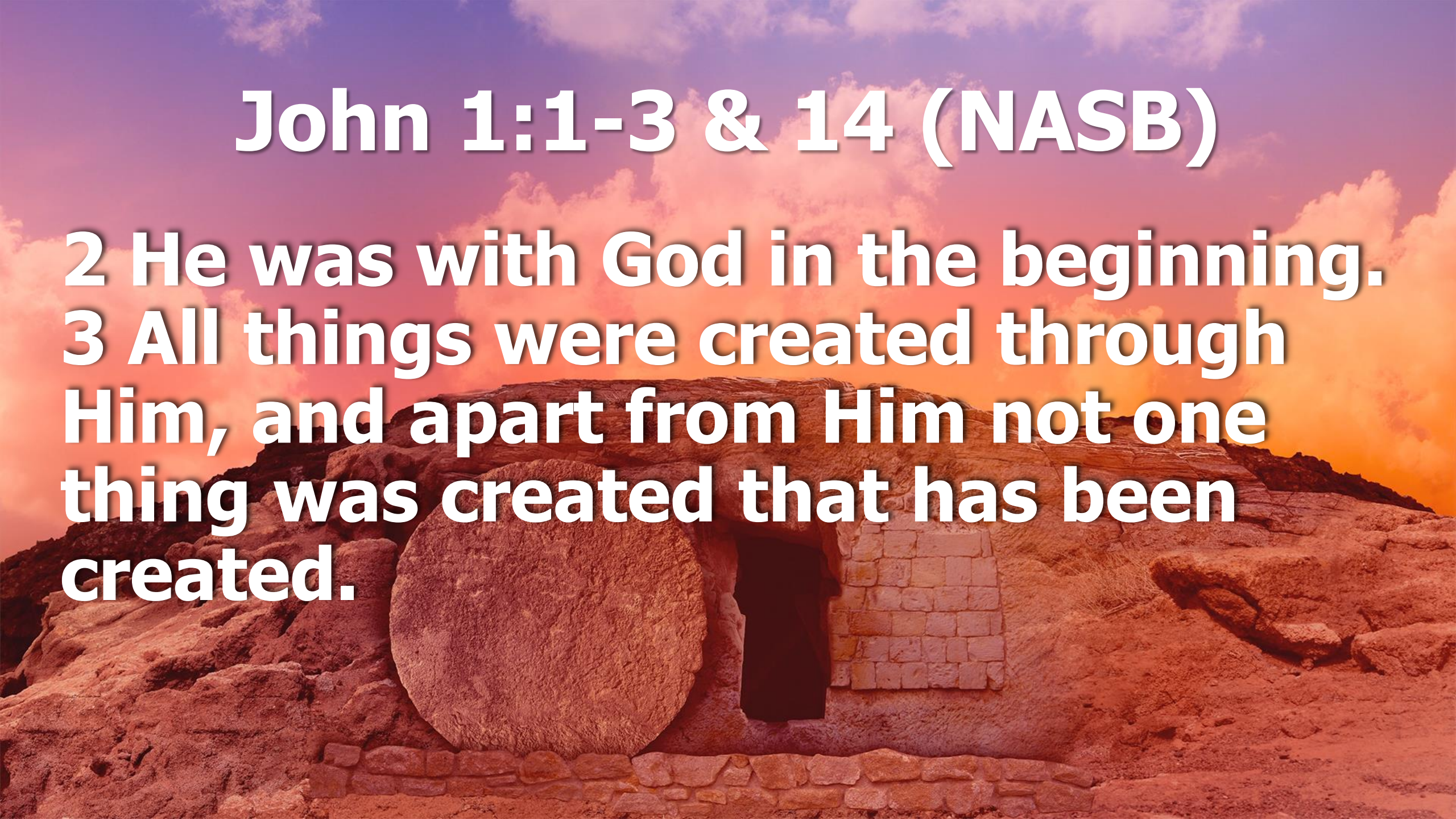
**1 In the beginning was the Word,

John 1:1-3 & 14 (NASB)

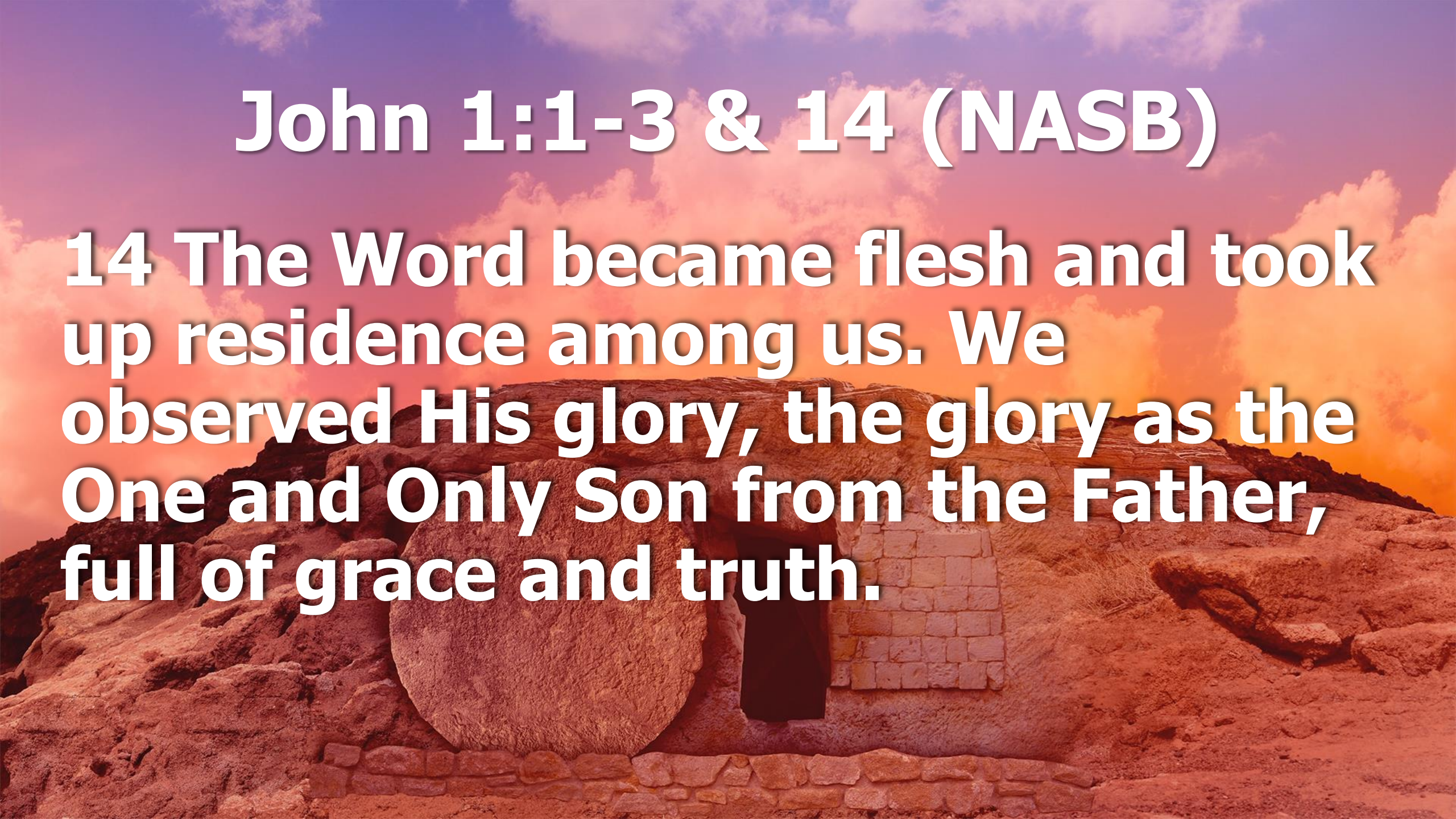
2 He was with God in the beginning.

3 All things were created through Him, and apart from Him not one thing was created that has been created.

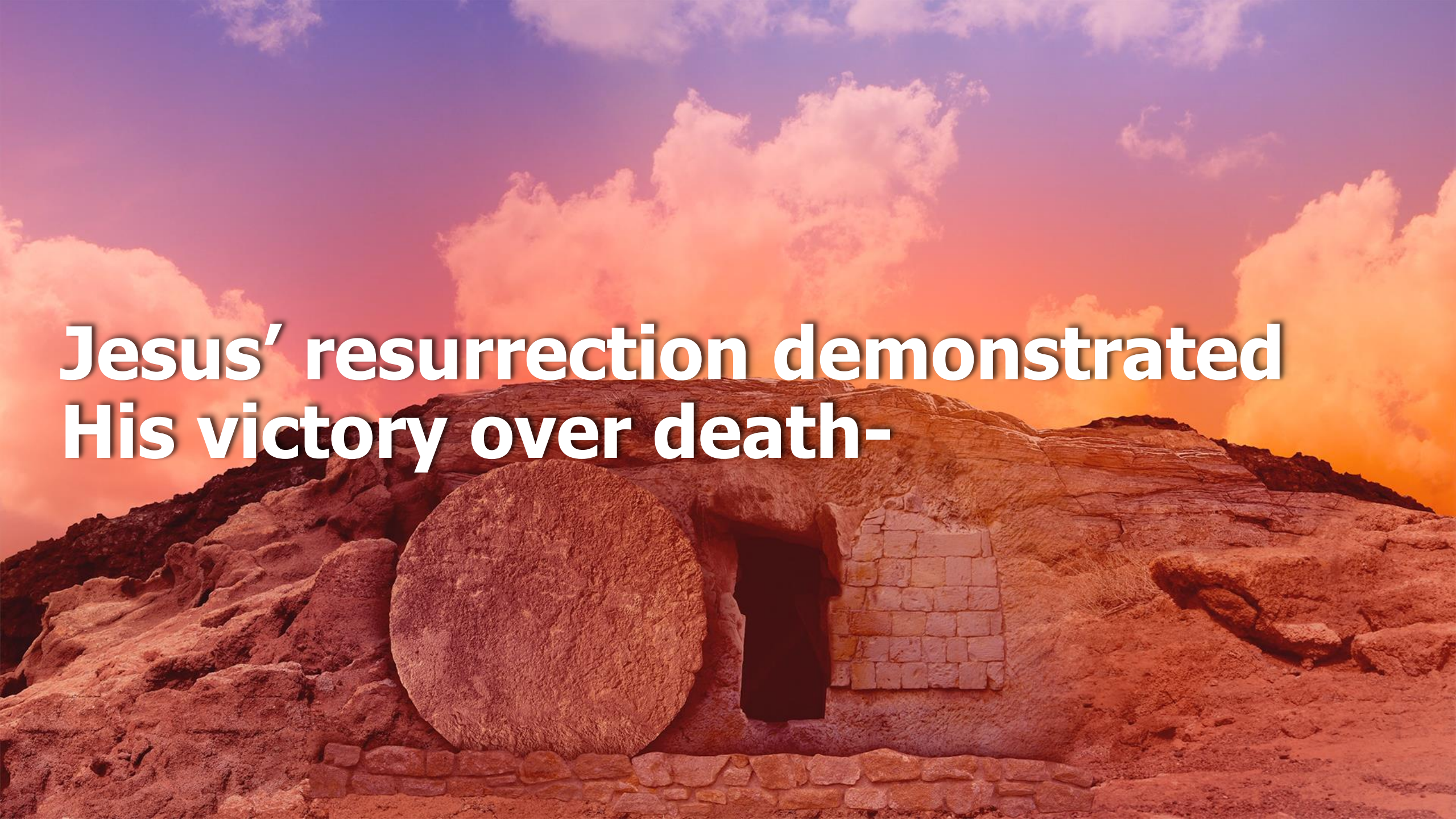


John 1:1-3 & 14 (NASB)

14 The Word became flesh and took up residence among us. We observed His glory, the glory as the One and Only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.

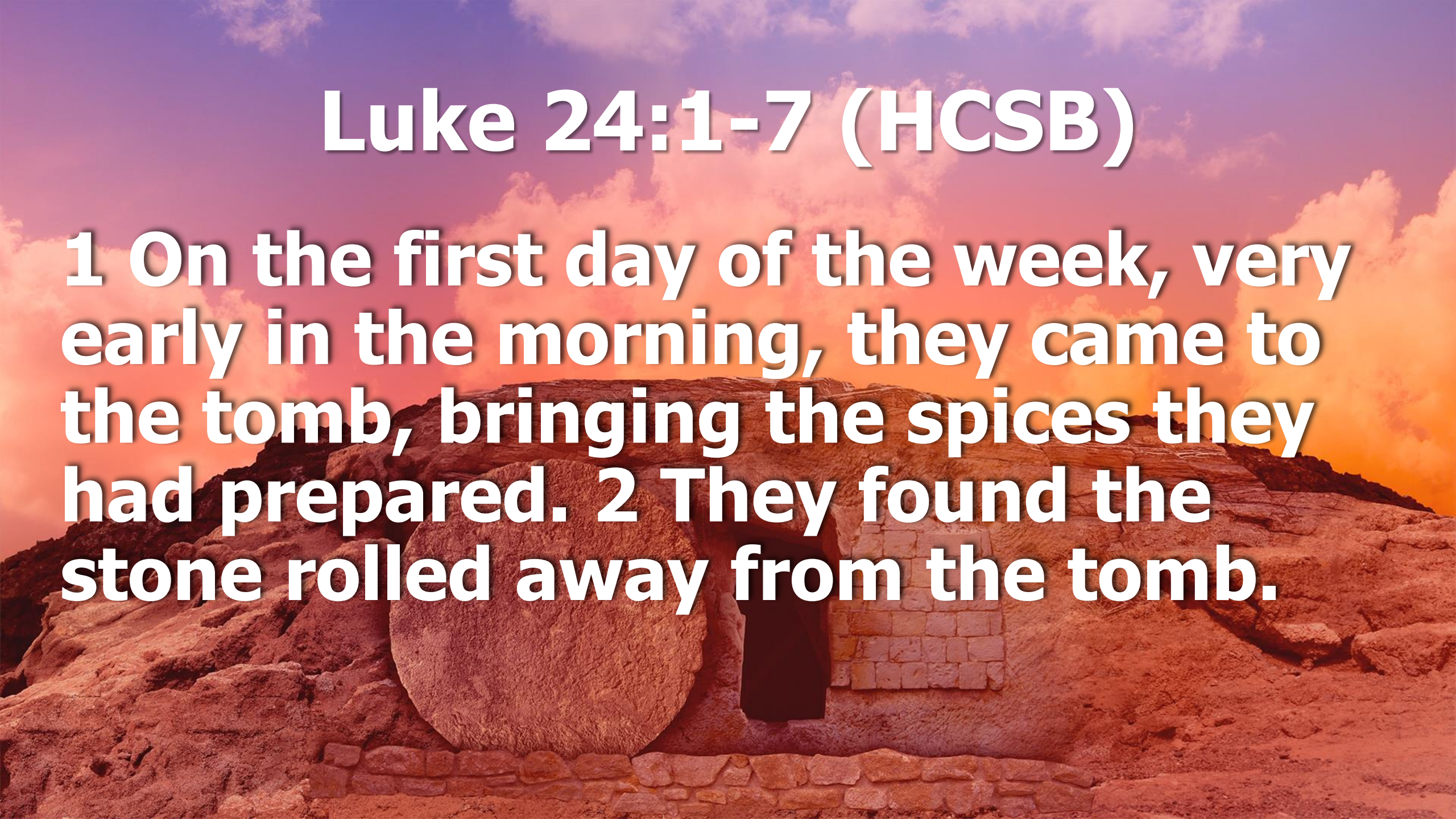

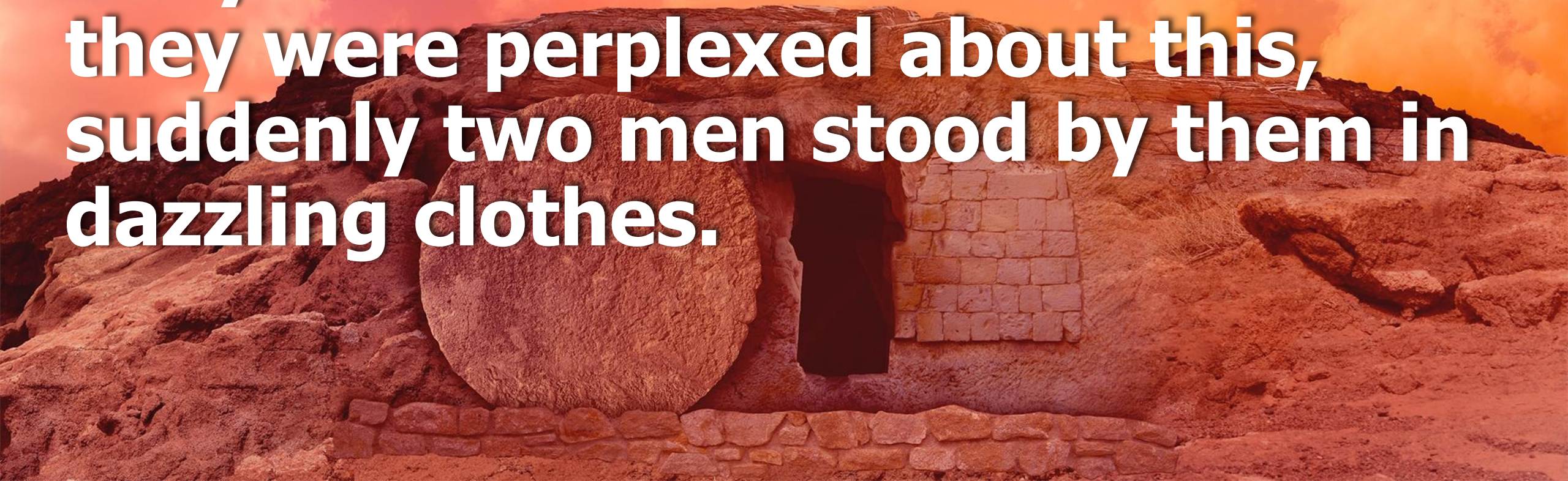
Luke 24:1-7 (HCSB)

1 On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they came to the tomb, bringing the spices they had prepared. 2 They found the stone rolled away from the tomb.




Luke 24:1-7 (HCSB)

3 They went in but did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. 4 While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men stood by them in dazzling clothes.

5 So the women were terrified and bowed down to the ground. “Why are you looking for the living among the dead?” asked the men. 6 “He is not here, but He has been resurrected!

Acts 13:32-39 (HCSB)

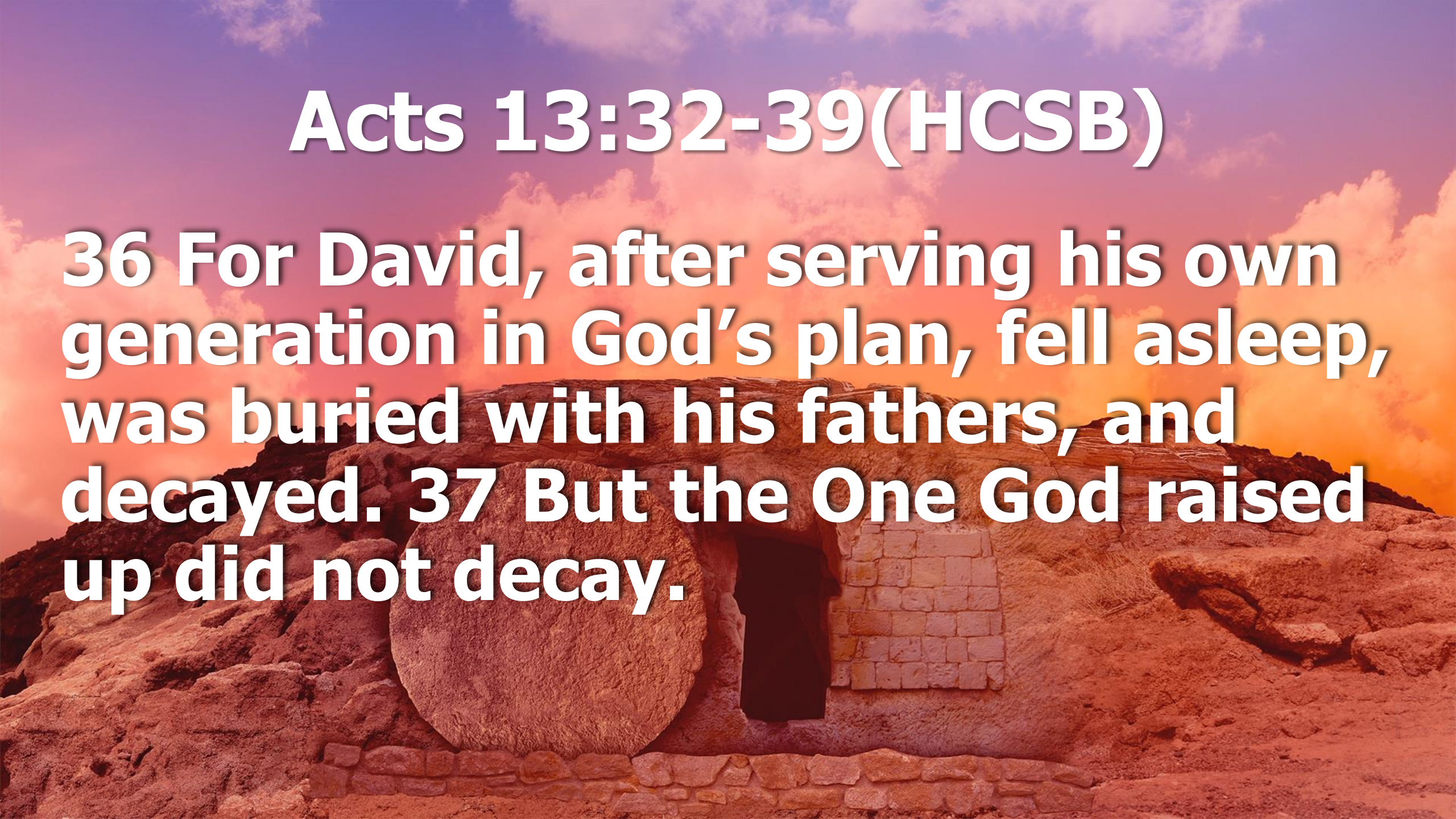

36 For David, after serving his own generation in God's plan, fell asleep, was buried with his fathers, and decayed. 37 But the One God raised up did not decay.

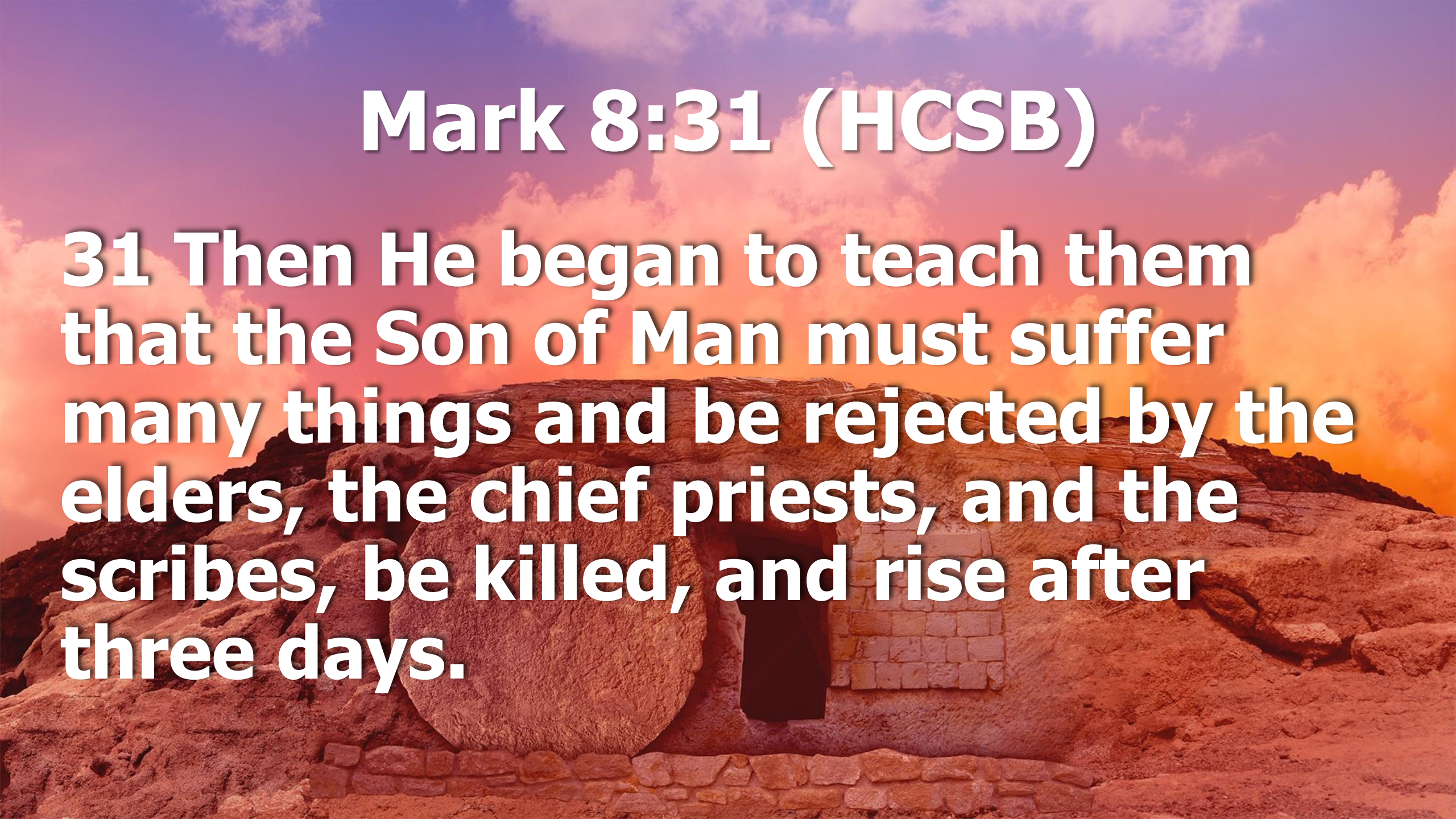


Acts 13:32-39 (HCSB)

Romans 1:3-4 (HCSB)

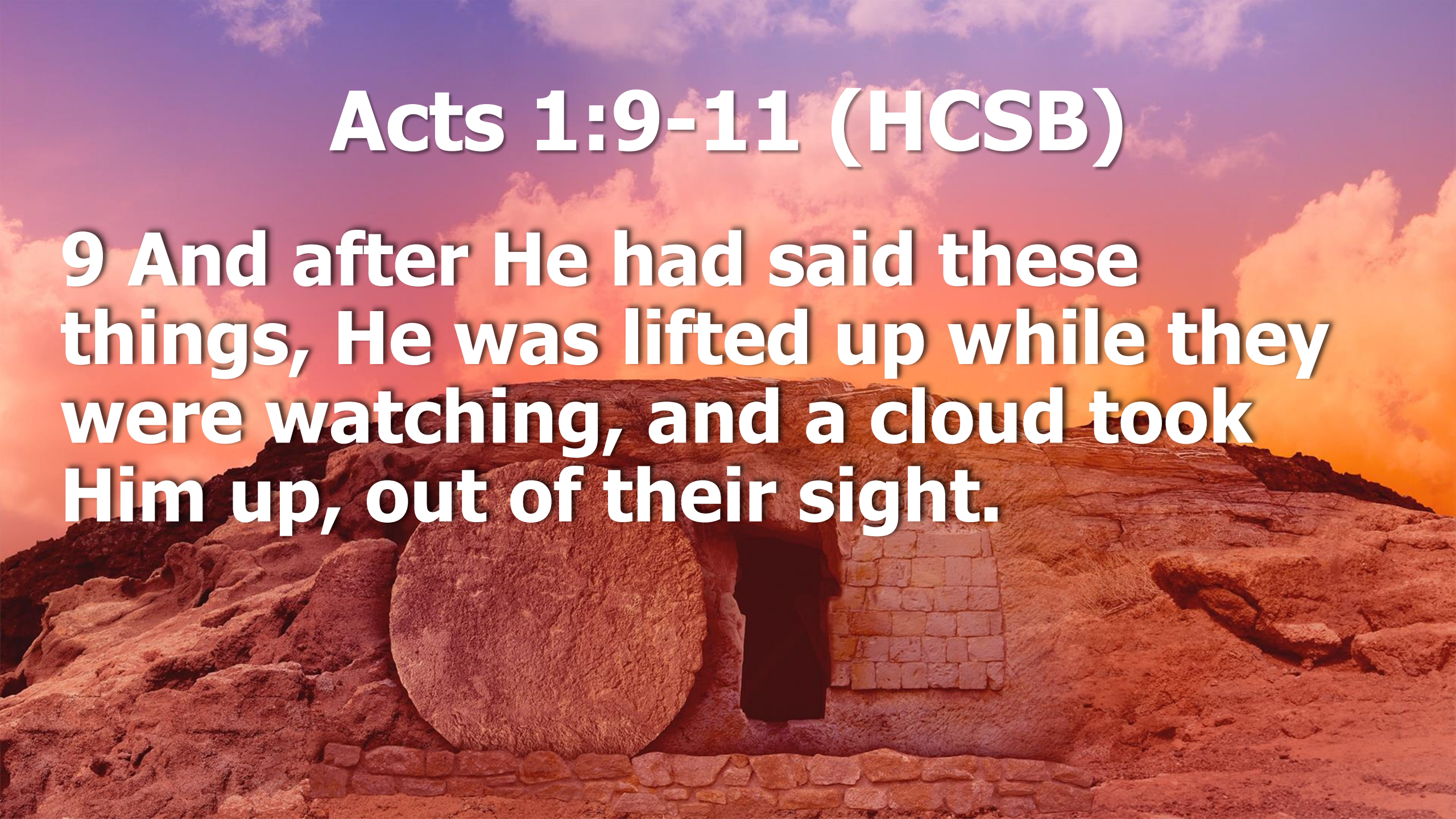

9 And after He had said these things, He was lifted up while they were watching, and a cloud took Him up, out of their sight.

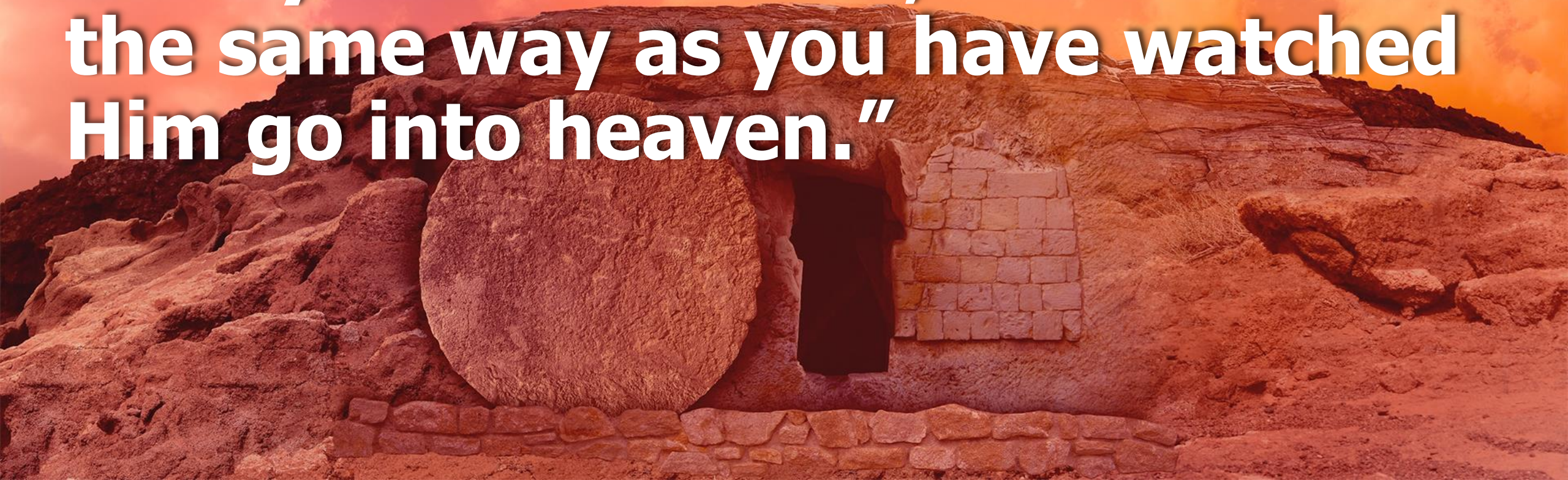


Acts 1:9-11 (HCSB)

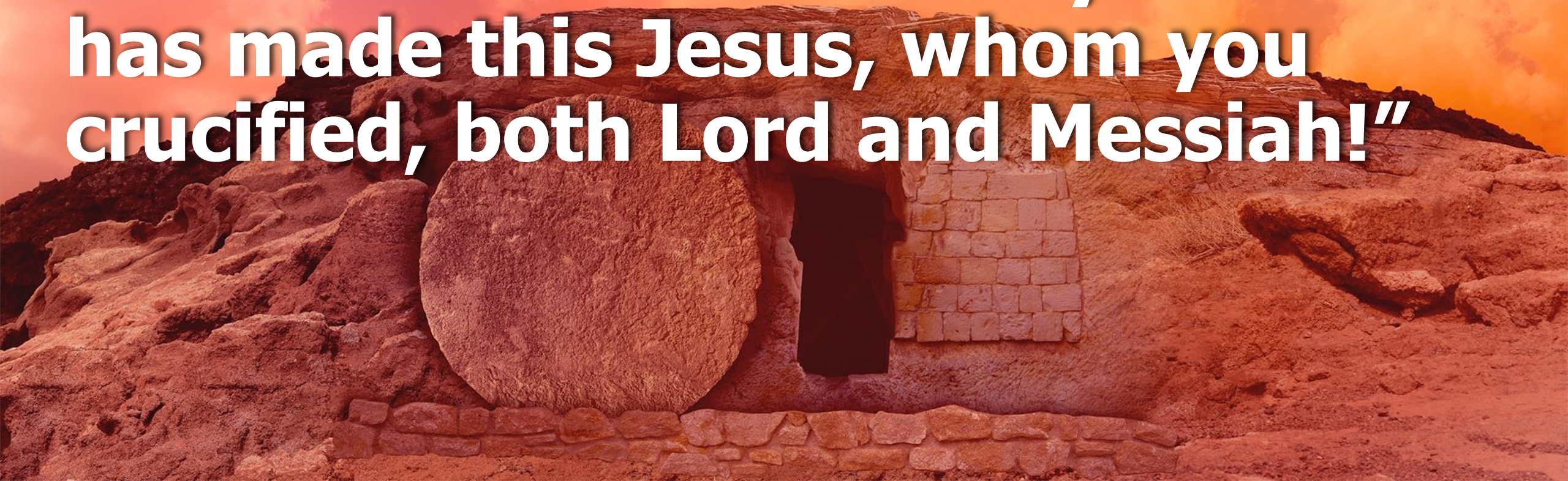
Acts 2:32-36 (HCSB)

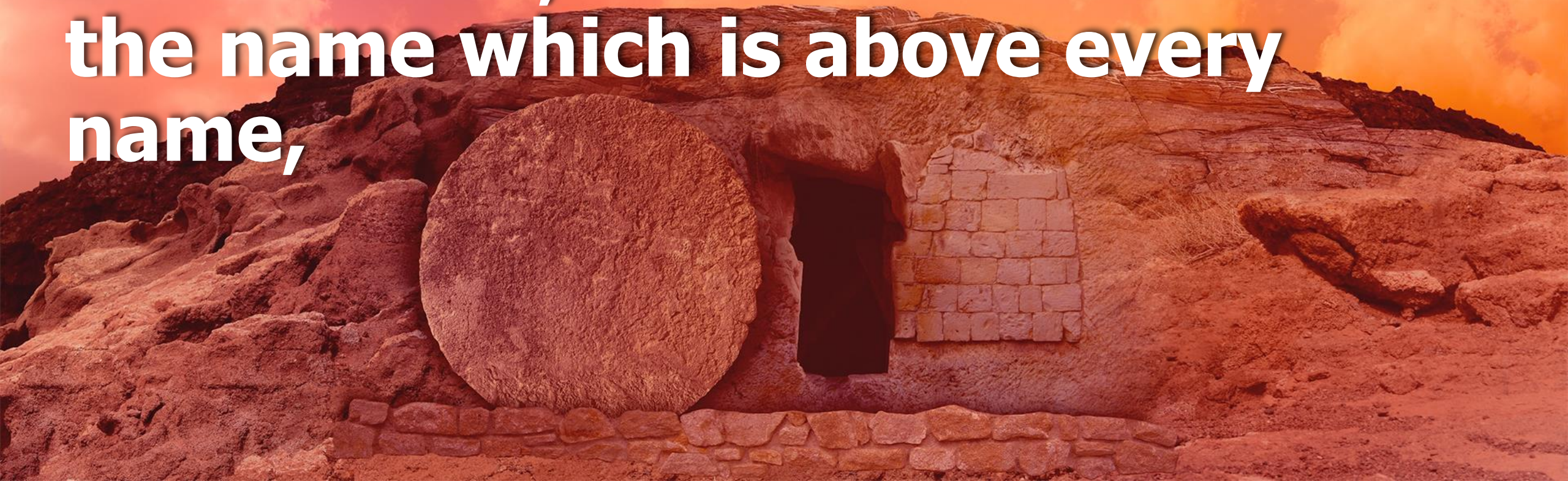
Acts 2:32-36 (HCSB)

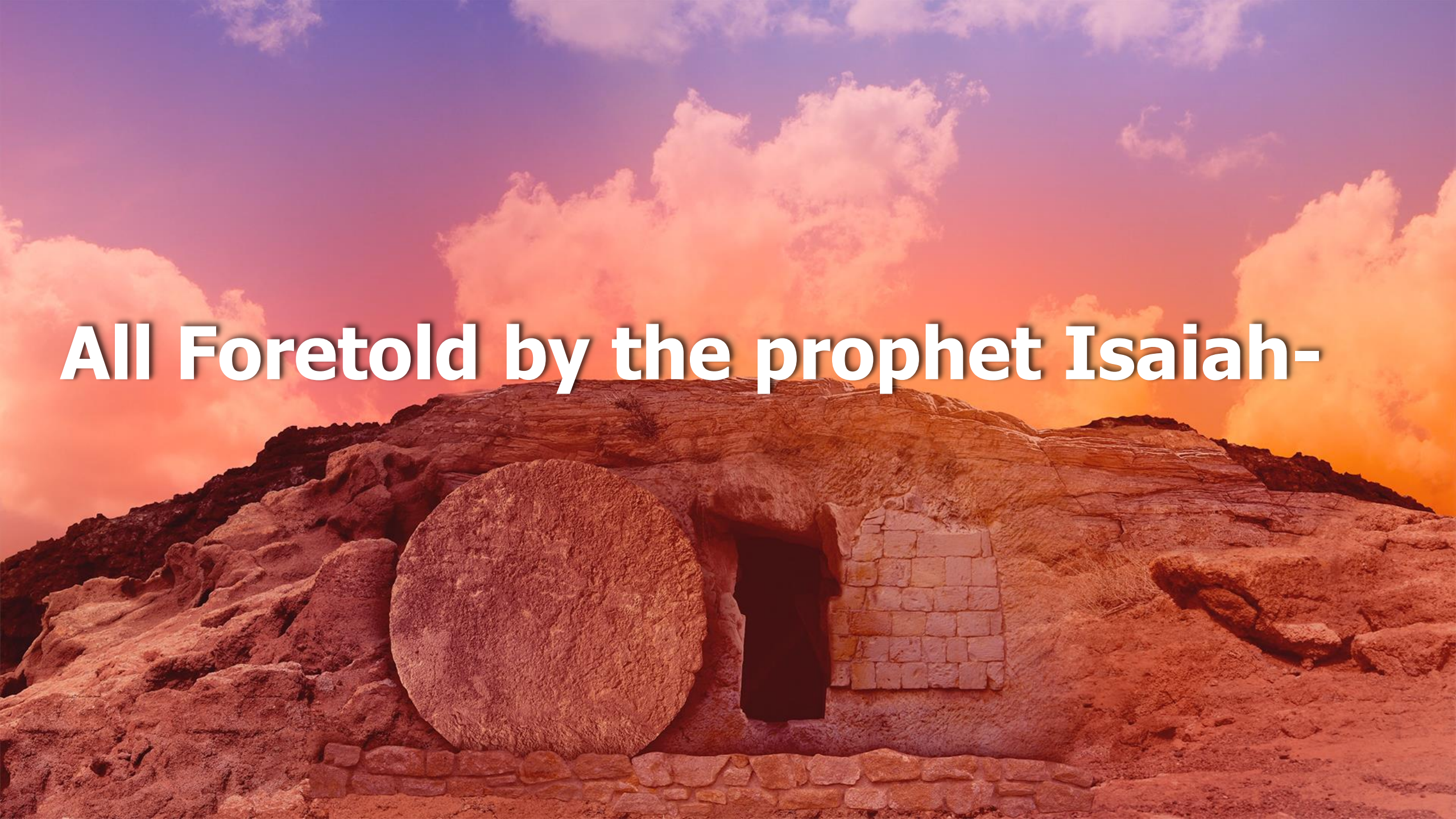
9 For this reason also God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name,

Isaiah 53:10-12 (HCSB)

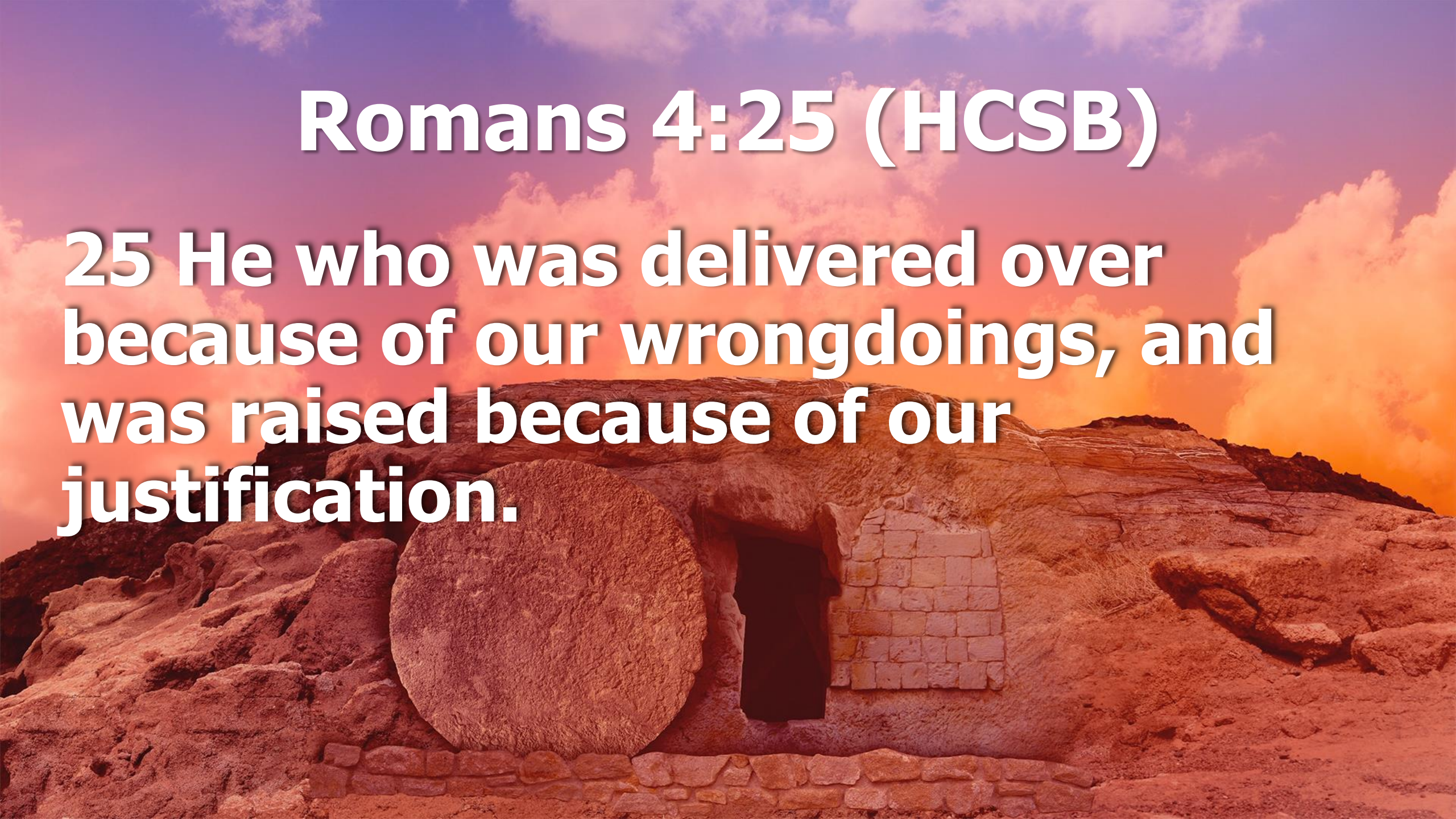

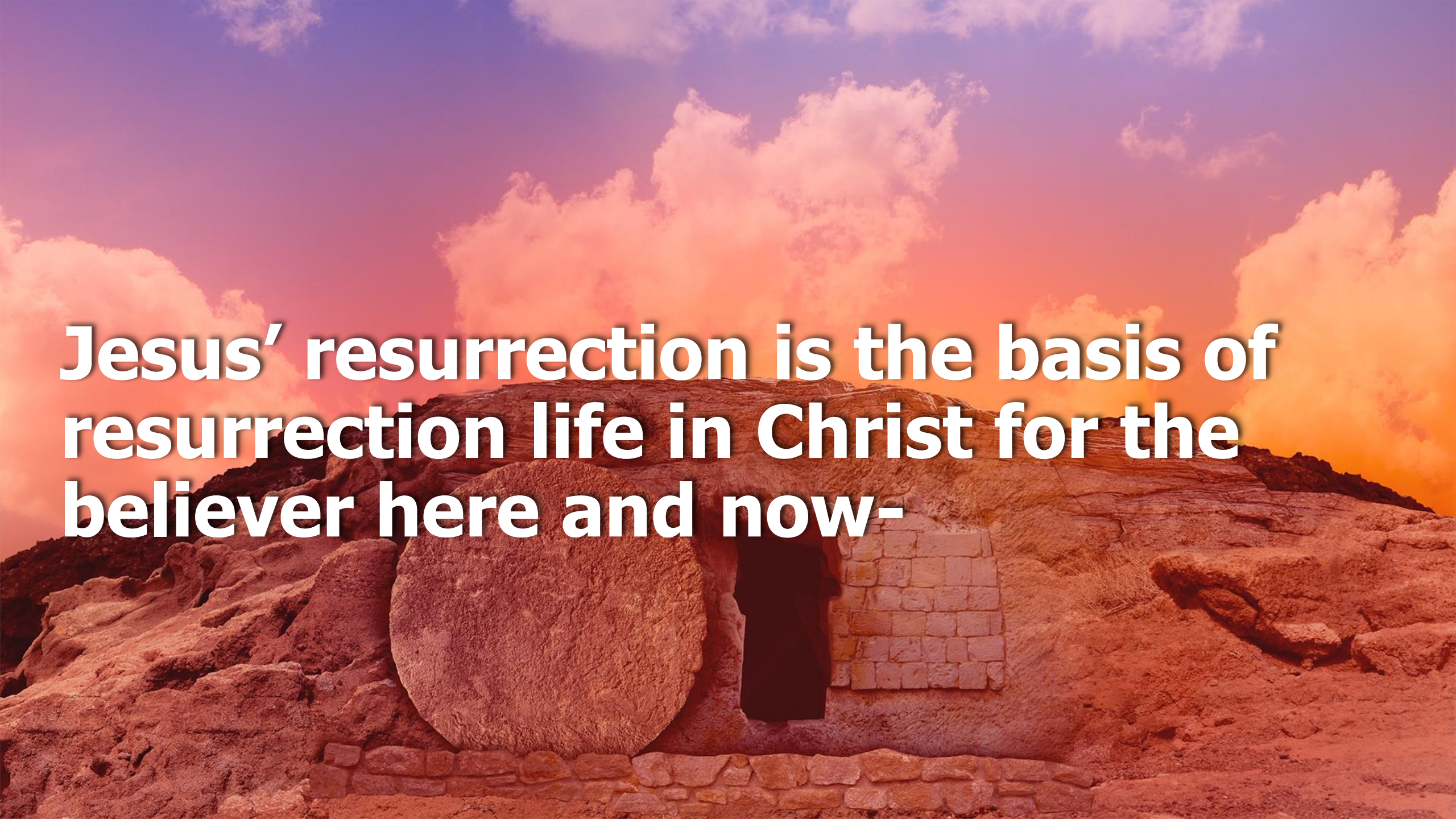

25 He who was delivered over because of our wrongdoings, and was raised because of our justification.




**Jesus' resurrection is the basis of

believer here and now-**



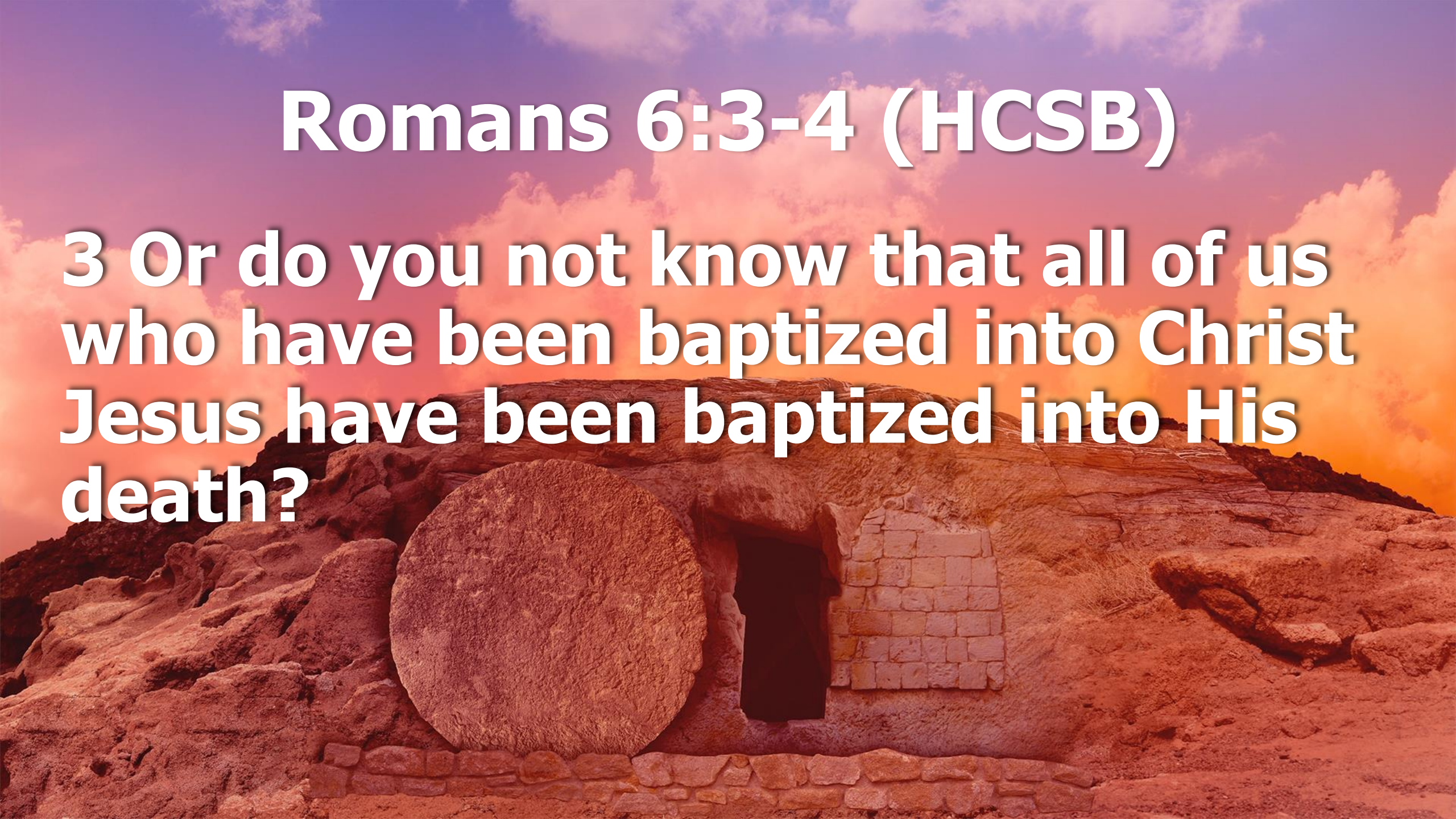
John 11:25-26 (HCSB)

Romans 6:3-4 (HCSB)

4 Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too may walk in newness of life.

Romans 6:8-11 (HCSB)

8 Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, 9 knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, is never to die again; death no longer is master over Him.

Romans 6:8-11 (HCSB)

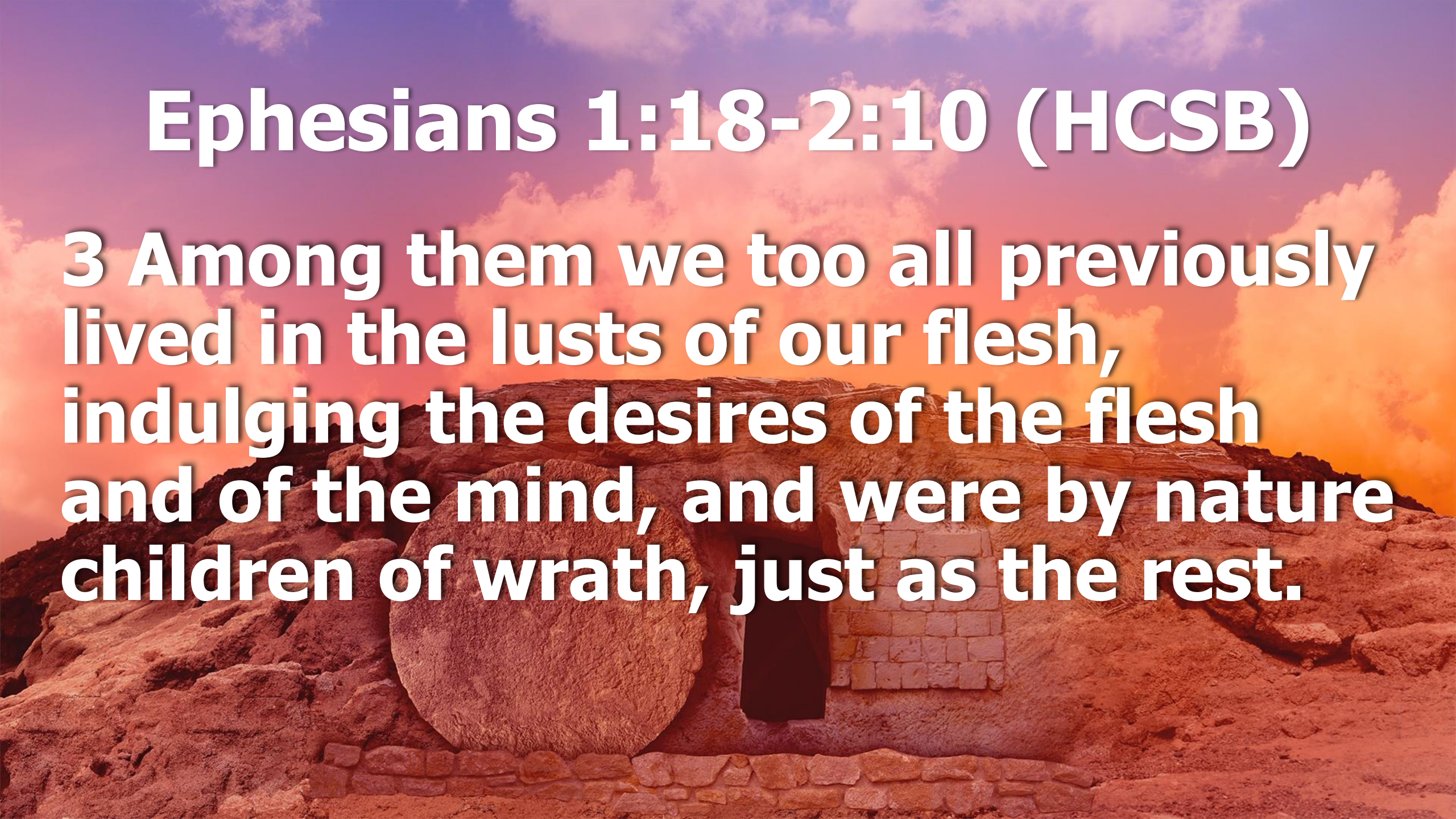

6 and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, 7 so that in the ages to come He might show the boundless riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.

Ephesians 1:18-2:10 (HCSB)

8 For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; 9 not a result of works, so that no one may boast. 10 For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them.

Romans 10:9-10 (HCSB)

9 If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. **10** One believes with the heart, resulting in righteousness, and one confesses with the mouth, resulting in salvation.
